

## Good Touch, Bad Touch

### **Promoting Safe Environments**

In an effort to ensure the safety and well-being of students, Prime Global School organized an important and informative session on "Good Touch and Bad Touch" for its students. The initiative aimed to educate students on differentiating appropriate physical contact from inappropriate actions, empowering them with the knowledge to recognize and report any uncomfortable situations.

The session began with a warm welcome from the school vice-Pramita principal Gurung, emphasizing the school's commitment to creating a safe and nurturing environment for students The vice-principal stressed the importance understanding boundaries and encouraged an open dialogue to address any concerns related to personal safety.





The discussion was led by trained counselors and professionals who outlined the concept of good touch, emphasizing examples such as a comforting hug, a high-five, or a handshake, which are appropriate forms of physical interaction within appropriate contexts. Students were encouraged to recognize and appreciate these positive forms of contact.

Furthermore, the session covered the critical topic of bad touch, describing actions that make individuals feel uncomfortable, violated, or scared. Students were provided with clear examples of inappropriate touches, such as unwanted hugs, touching private body parts without consent, or any form of violence. Life as a School Nurse

My experience at school was very challenging and overcoming my personal struggles was not an easy task. While my nursing background includes a variety of setting (hospital, home health, health department) my true love and passion is within the school setting. As a school nurse, I'm enjoying the challenge of making each student visit an educational teach opportunity to promotion, disease prevention and care for the medical needs of students on a daily basis. I've been taking care of daily health needs of students by providing minor first-aid care, caring for ill children and monitoring health school requirements for students.

It takes a perfect mix of art and science to work as a school nurse in the educational setting. Being only a medical professional within the walls of a school, I've a great deal of responsibility of those inside the school. I am ready to respond to a potential medical emergency at any given time. As a hospital nurse, I was tired of not having enough time to spend with family. The amazing bonus of working as a school nurse is the work time with a set schedule. Even though infirmary gets busy and chaotic, I've pleasure working with my dear students, student families and school staffs.



In Nepal, the Dashain holiday season begins in late September. Dashain is one of Nepal's most auspicious festivals. During Dashain, we give and receive blessings as well as tika (vermillion) and dakshina (a money gift) offerings to our family members and close friends. Dashain is a fifteen-day holiday, with the first, seventh, eighth, ninth, and tenth days being particularly important for festivities.

On the day of Ghatasthapana, when we sow maize and sorghum seeds in sand and mud in a dark room where we practice religious worship, Dashain begins. The festival of Fulpati is observed with a formal ceremony in Tundikhel on the seventh day of Dashain. From Tundikhel, a Fulpati parade makes its way to the president of Nepal's house. The Maha Asthami, or eighth day of Dashain, is devoted to Goddess Kali, one of the incarnations of Goddess Durga. People around the nation offer goats, hens, and buffaloes as sacrifices in temples to appease the fiery goddess Kali. Lord Vishwakarma is worshipped on Mahanavami, the ninth day of Dashain.

On the ninth day of Dashain, people worship machinery, equipment, and automobiles. The Taleju Temple, whose doors are only opened to the general public during Mahanavami, is one of the festival's primary attractions. One of the most significant days for Nepalese people is Vijaya Dashami, which falls on the tenth day of Dashain. The elders apply tika and jamara to the youngsters. These are holy ceremonies because tika and jamara stand for blessings that are passed down from elders to younger generations. Dashain is a long holiday where people greet each other with festival greetings. It entails flying kites, wearing new clothes, enjoying yummy food, and spending quality time with family. In Hindu mythology, Dashain represents Goddess Durga's victory over the demonic Mahishasura. It denotes the Victory of good over evil.

Additionally, it stands for Lord Ram's victory against Ravan, the evil king. Goddess Durga conquered Mahishasura on the tenth day of Dashain, which is celebrated as Vijaya Dashami, after a nine-days of battle. Dashain is a holiday that denotes harmony and prosperity among countrymen. Dashain represented a break from schoolwork, a chance to shop for new clothes, and special moments spent with family.


### **FACULTY SPOTLIGHT**

Niraj Khadka (BSc. CSIT & BCA Faculty)



In June, our team received an email inviting us to the Robot Challenge 2023, an international eventheld in China involving 24 nations. Excited by the opportunity to participate after the COVID-19 pandemic, we prepared for two competitions: Line following - Adult and Puck Collector. We built the robot bodies using MDF and carefully selected the necessary hardware. For line following, we used an 8-array line sensor and an Atmega328 microcontroller with a PID controller for precision. Despite slower motors from China, finally we secured the THIRD prize.In the Puck Collector competition, our team employed computer vision with OpenCV and equipped the robot with a camera to differentiate between red and blue pucks.

We used a centerline to navigate and collect the pucks, with a color sensor and servo-activated gate mechanism to sort them. Our approach showcased the application of our institution's curriculum, combining Open CV, ARM programming, and concepts from their B.Sc. CSIT program. Our team achieved the FIRST prize in this competition. The competition day in China was very fun and a good learning experience and the strong learning that I experienced over there was that we are equally capable of designing and building robots as other developed countries are. Winning the prize, I would like to thank Prime College for giving me an opportunity to sharpen my knowledge regularly by giving me the chance to teach and mentor my fellow students..


Meanwhile, the design thinking workshops have tapped into students' creativity, and Event Management has sharpened their organizational abilities.



Good company is always welcome." Phew, I was relieved and grateful to have her as a companion. It's these kinds of memories that made the challenges of adjusting to life in a new country easier to bear.


